- 120 small businesses created
- 150 women were able to provide at least one meal to their families
- 250 vulnerable women accessed business skills
- 110 children received food and other basic needs
- 60 families improved on their Sanitation and hygiene
- 4 new women groups were created
- 95 vulnerable women and families mentored



WHO IS SUSTAIN MICRO ENTERPRISE?

Sustain Micro Enterprise is a charity organization based in Uganda working with the poor women, orphaned and vulnerable children and their families since 2010. We believe that to fight poverty, poor women and children in need must to be involved and empowered.

Our programmes aim at building a world where women and children are free from vulnerability by providing women empowerment, child sponsorship and protection, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH).

Sustain Micro Enterprise believes that no woman or child should be vulnerable.

Small loans received by the vulnerable women



Small loans to the vulnerable women means new hope. In Uganda, Many of the poor women cannot access any loan anywhere in financial institutions because they lack collateral security such as property or land. Thank God Sustain Micro Enterprise opened its hand widely to make small loans accessible to the poorest women. Women received loans and were able to establish small businesses and other income generating activities.

Small businesses and income generating activities established by women

Without a business, many single mothers, widows and grandmothers and women in extreme poverty cannot feed their children and the result is that their families go on empty stomachs. With our work on the grassroots and your continuous support, we helped the women and their families establish small businesses and income generating activities. Small businesses such as retail shops, grocery, second hand clothes, brick making, fresh foods and restaurants were established and sustained.







Lydia can now feed her 3 children with a small loan she received!


With a small loan, Lydia Hamba was able to start up a charcoal and firewood business in her local community. Lydia is very thankful and happy that she can now provide food and school fees for her children. Business skills training



Our business skills training give an opportunity to the vulnerable women to learn about new skills on how to startup businesses and income generating activities. Business training also provides a source of hope to the poor women that they can start a new life in business.





We continue to walk with the vulnerable women and their families a journey out of poverty. Once a small loan and business training is done, women and family Mentorship takes on. Our Business mentor supports the child and woman. family to push on life with a positive mindset. Through Mentorship, the poor women received ongoing business advice, small loan management and shared the Word of God to build their hopes.

Women Group formation

Women groups are great tool which is used by Sustain Micro Enterprise to fight poverty among the vulnerable women. We saw more groups created during our year of work and we are very thankful to God. Through the women groups, all the other activities conducted. are stories shared, women relationship nurtured, word of God shared and hopes revived. 4 women groups were established.

Zip Wire Fundraising Challenge






