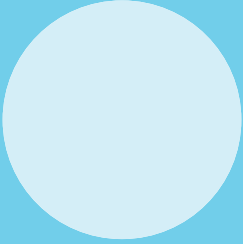

WHO IS SUSTAIN MICRO ENTERPRISE ?

Sustain Micro Enterprise is a non-profit organization in Uganda empowering vulnerable women and their families to fight poverty. We believe that to improve and transform lives in vulnerable families, we must empower women.

Our programmes aim at building a world where women are free from vulnerability by providing microfinance, business skills training, micro enterprise development , mentorship and other empowerment projects.

Sustain Micro Enterprise believes that no woman should be vulnerable.

Small loans received by the vulnerable women



Small loans remain a key contributor to the livelihoods of many vulnerable women in Uganda. However, the majority of women cannot access loans because they do not have the security or collateral required by financial institutions. Sustain Micro Enterprise enables vulnerable women to access collateral free small loans. This helps them to start up small businesses or improve on their existing businesses and other income-generating activities

Small businesses and income generating activities established by women

Business skills training provides a great opportunity for many vulnerable women to learn the new skills required to start up a small business. Because the women we work with are illiterate, they lack the skills required to establish a sustainable business. Without the required business skills they risk their new business failing and consequently being unable to sustain their lives and families.

We are glad to share with you that this year Sustain Micro Enterprise was able to help a number of women to learn about business skills. The women accessed business training through their women's groups and women entrepreneurship outreach. After the training the number of women setting up small businesses increased and their businesses were sustained.





Small businesses created:

The lives of vulnerable women and their families entirely depends on small businesses and income-generating activities. As we work with the women we put an emphasis on ensuring that each woman in our program is able to set up and run a small business or income-generating activity to support herself and her children.

With your continuous support, we have helped women to set up small businesses. The businesses established include, retail shops, grocery, brick making, fish selling, charcoal selling, second hand clothes selling, bakery business, food vending, and local brewing.

Business skills training



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One to One Mentorship:



Sustain Micro Enterprise believes in building strong working relationships with the vulnerable women. Through our mentorship programme, we assist and teach women as they to help them work their way out of poverty. This helps them to put the business skills theory into practice in their own businesses. We conducted weekly one-to-one mentorship sessions and focused on disciplines, such as record keeping, profit determination, pricing and customer care. All the mentorship sessions have a weekly follow up and review.

Our special thanks to Sarah Whitlam who volunteered with us and designed our mentorship programme so that we can have a farther reaching impact.

Women's Groups:



With our business model, much of our work is accomplished through the women's groups. We aim to increase the number of groups each year. Through women groups, we are able to provide business training, as well as, small loans that are provided and guaranteed through the specific women's groups. Throughout this past year, we were able to establish four women's groups.

Scholastic materials for children:



We helped orphans and vulnerable children access scholastic materials which enabled them to attend school. The materials that were given to the children included books, pens, pencils, pads, and reading books. When the children received the scholastic materials from our office, we also provided them with life skills, counseling and health talks.

Give a Goat project:



It was a great year, full of achievements and new projects. Through the funding from our St. Martins Church, Sustain Micro Enterprise was able to establish a goats project called "Give a Goat". The project started by giving out seven goats to different women so that they can use the animal to support their families. Once the goats reproduce, the women and their families will be able to sell the young ones and earn an extra income, while keeping the adult goat for further reproduction. As we came towards the end of the year, our Give a Goat project had helped eight vulnerable women and families to own a goat and profit off their goat. We are greatly appreciative of St. Martin's Church for helping us to start up this project. Without your generous support, it would have been impossible to kick start this project.

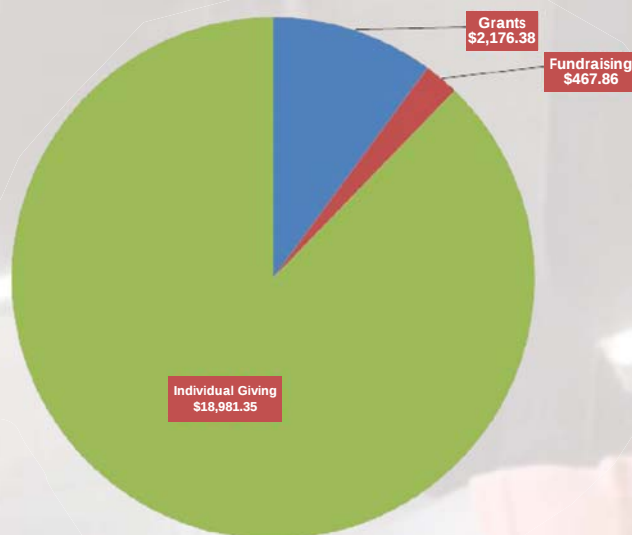
Volunteers

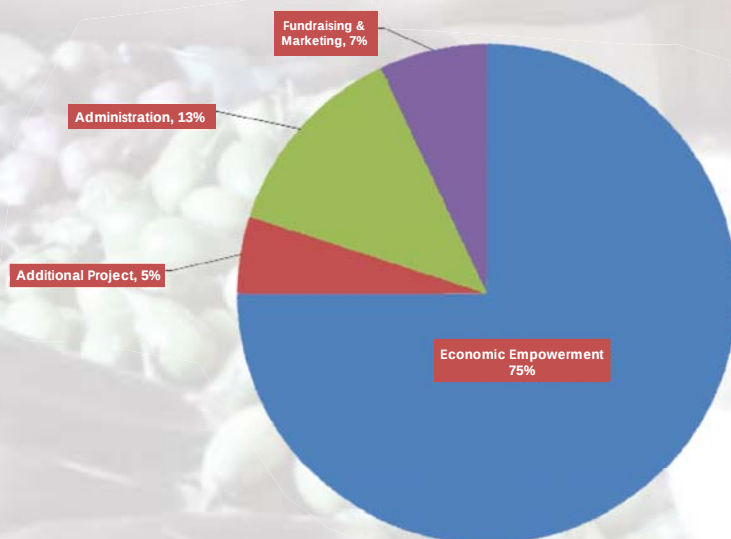
FINANCIAL OVERVIEW 2017
