Projects: additional projects such as *Give a Goat*, and *Hygiene* and *Sanitation* empower vulnerable women to raise themselves out of poverty.

## SME believes that every woman should be empowered!

### **Small Start up loans received:**



Through small start-up loans, SME enabled the 125 vulnerable women to create income generating activities and small businesses. It is difficult for the women such as widows, grandmothers and women living in extreme poverty to access any capital due to poverty and what makes it worse is that they don't own collateral which is often required by financial institutions to access a loan to start-up any businesses. Our work therefore embraced these women who are excluded by traditional financial institutions and enabled them to access collateral free small loans. The women used the start-up loans to kick start their small businesses. Thank you everyone who shared your generous gift to help the women access the much need small start-up loans.

## **Small businesses development:**

Our goal is to enable every vulnerable woman to own a small business so that she can provide for her family. We believe once a woman has a business, her stream of income is secured. She can confidently provide for her children with the basic needs without worry. Throughout the year, we enabled 125 women create diversified businesses and these among others included retail shop, fresh foods, charcoal sell, fish smoking, brick making, sewing, baking, farming, and second hand clothes.





#### **BUSINESS SKILLS TRAINING:**



It was a lovely year empowering women and school dropout girls with business and entrepreneurship skills. We work in the rural setting and communities, women who live here are totally vulnerable and illiterate, cannot read or write and thus have never been to school. Many have no skills or knowledge in business and yet it is only through creation of businesses small that the women can have an income and provide for their families.

Through our business training classes, 350 women were able to acquire skills necessary to run and sustain a business. Key areas covered included record keeping, customer care, marketing, business tree, products/sales among others.

#### ONE TO ONE MENTORSHIP:



SME believes in building strong working relationships with the vulnerable women. Through our mentorship programme, we continuously assist and teach women as they work their way out of poverty. This helps them to put their business skills into practice while running their own businesses. We conducted weekly one-to-one mentorship sessions and focused on disciplines such as record keeping, determination, profit pricing and customer care. Follow-ups on the women and their small businesses were conducted!

#### Women's groups:



4 women's groups were created!

We continued to establish and new women's create groups in order to reach and serve more vulnerable Through women. the women groups, were able to women small start-up access loans and business training together. Four additional groups were set up.

# **GIVE A GOAT PROJECT:**



Give a Goat project is helping to transform the lives of women and their families. We started out this project in 2017 by benefiting only 8 women and families. We are happy to share with you that this project has since grown from just 8 goats given to the women to now 20 goats. The goats are reproducing and increasing in numbers, women are selling off the young ones and earning an income. We are happy to see the impact the goats can have on the lives of women, children and the entire family.

## HOW YOU CAN HELP
